Biography:

Jerome Howell was born on September 10th, 1998 in Greensboro, North Carolina in the United States. His family quickly moved to the Research Triangle area of the state in pursuit of a job for his father in the cities and a competitive school for engineering for Howell. He graduated top of his class from Research Triangle High School, and was offered a full ride scholarship to North Carolina State University. Citing a desire to go to college with a Sabrina Porter, he denied this and graduated early in 2021 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering from Duke University.

In 2019, Howell was approached by Foundation recruiters embedded within the North Carolina Triangle area and offered access to the Rising Engineer Fellowship, an engineering scholarship advertised to students as involving work on secret government projects that require a security clearance. Once vetted and inducted, Howell accepted the resulting offer for future Foundation employment and began taking specialized classes for anomalous parascience.

After graduating, and taking advantage of the staff restructuring which occurred under the promotion of Thomas Graham to Site Director of Site-17, Jerome Howell received a position offer at the site. Him and his wife Sabrina Porter were relocated to the northern American midwest alongside Lindsey Koh, whom he met due to her inclusion in the Foundation's R.S.F. sister program for recruiting doctors out of the nation's top medical schools.

Accolades:

- Currently one of the leading experts on reality anchor and stabilization technology at Site-17. His developments on miniaturization of the technology at Site-17 were published and are recognized in papers on the subject outside of the site ecosystem.
- Applied ontokinetic research and miniaturization developments into the site security system as part of Site-17's United Front Initiative. Newly introduced 'reality-checking' hardware and software inside metal detector, fingerprint reader, and retinal scanner stations made them capable of detecting anomalous humanoids with a high success rate.
- Personally selected by Assistant Director Goode for work on specialized projects, see [REDACTED AS PER NEW GUIDELINES UNDER UNITED FRONT REGULATION D11.5]. Advised on and recommended other staff for the project, such as

Lindsey Koh.

Family:

Jerome Howell's immediate family currently still resides in Durham, North Carolina. The only family member to follow him to his new position at Site-17 was his wife, Sabrina Porter.

After a year of service at Site-17, Howell renewed his overtime contract with Site-17 and rescinded pending applications for paternal leave the following year. Two years after their move, he requested separate lodgings for both himself and Ms. Porter. Jerome Howell and Sabrina Porter are now unmarried.
