Exhibit A: Commandeering of Foundation Security Systems

Walker's Foundation-issued computer had been modified with LAVeye, a spyware program developed by the GOC for the purposes of remotely monitoring groups of interest with their own surveillance technology. Through the use of social engineering, primarily through getting non-technology literate staff to download trojan horses into local SCiPnet servers, Walker managed to create a backdoor into the security systems of four sites (Site-223, Site-55, Site-113, and Site-61), and used the confidential information she gathered by doing so to increase ETTRA's chances of acquiring desired anomalies.

Through looking at their automatic security logs, Site-55 security were able to confirm that an unidentified third party gained access to their security systems from 8:00 AM to approximately 10:00 AM on September 13th, which matches local records within Walker's LAVeye instance, and notes taken by Walker about an all hands on deck meeting Director Adler had called due to a near containment breach the day prior.

Exhibit B: Fraudulent SCiPnet Accounts

Walker operated twelve fraudulent SCiPnet accounts, all of which were intended to spoof the accounts of high-ranking Foundation officials. Walker used these accounts to transfer anomalies into ETTRA custody without the knowledge of the officials transferring them.

Examples:

Username: metanoiaar@scp.int

Password: 0229ydrsx3268

Explanation: Used to impersonate Amelie Rose Metanoia, the director of the Anomalous Entity Engagement Division. When using this account, Walker would usually claim that AEED had discovered a site which would be better equipped to contain an anomaly which was giving the targeted site trouble.

Username: cfcostello@scp.int

Password: 1231c0987kc4361s2309

Explanation: Camilla Francine Costello was a fictional persona adopted by Walker who claimed to be part of the Foundation's Anomaly Transferal Committee. Walker would use this account to further the illusion that these transfers were legitimate, whenever one of her targets raised questions about authenticity.

Username: hacheya@scp.int

Password: 0009ryev1825

Explanation: Anthony Hachey is the director of acquisitions at Site-17. Walker would use this account to get staff to transfer anomalous humanoids into ETTRA custody, by claiming Site-17 was better equipped to manage the mental health concerns of anomalous humanoids

Username: kellyyvonne@scp.int

Password: 0000Lo0000

Explanation: Yvonne Kelly is a low ranking member of RAISA, tasked with investigating discrepancies in internal Foundation records. Walker utilized this account to cover her tracks, by reporting any holes in the records which would indicate fraudulent behavior as errors.

Exhibit C: Unauthorized Surveillance on Foundation Employees

Utilizing her fraudulent SCiPnet credentials, and her access to various site security systems, as well as other social engineering methods, Walker collected various examples of high ranking Foundation officials engaging in behavior prohibited by the Foundation. It is believed Walker intended to use this information for blackmail purposes, however investigations have yet to reveal a concrete example of Walker doing so.

These files were located on a personal computer owned by Walker, which she attempted to destroy shortly before her apartment was raided by Foundation officials. All files were successfully recovered by investigative technomancers employed by the Foundation.
