DESCRIPTION:

LTE-111-Moro-Typhon-Kringlechild constituted a species of snail-like entities sharing characteristics similar to commonly accepted pop-cultural dragons, such as fire breath, scales, and thagomizer osteoderms on their tails. There were a total of 6 subspecies made by their creator, KTE-Kringlefather. The location of KTE-Kringlefather remains unknown to PNEUMA Division.

HISTORY AND LIQUIDATION:

LTE-111-Moro-Typhon-Kringlechild was not originally scheduled for destruction due to not being perceived as a threat, however, following a fire started by the object's breath, their continued existence was deemed a threat. PHYSICS Personnel were initially instructed to toss the objects into the on-Site incinerator, but this was stopped following close examination of documents recovered from Directive 1221-KINGMAKER in which an instance of LTE-111-Moro-Typhon-Kringlechild survived a house fire, also caused by its fire breath.

Following this, PNEUMA Division personnel were consulted on a humane means of destroying the objects. According to PNEUMA personnel, the most humane way to destroy a snail is to drown them in 70% alcohol. This was, however, deemed unfeasible due to LTE-111-Moro-Typhon-Kringlechild's fire breath possibly activating as they were lowered into the solution.

LTE-111-Moro-Typhon-Kringlechild were destroyed via blunt force trauma with a shovel against pavement of [REDACTED]
