DESCRIPTION:

LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork was a red plastic chair. The object was capable of detecting the efforts of containment carried out on it and counteracting them, typically by teleporting, but the object was also believed to be capable of altering time.

HISTORY AND LIQUIDATION:

LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork was a historically difficult object for Kewpie to contain due to its properties. Following Directive-1221 KINGMAKER, concerns regarding LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork and the feasibility of it remaining in one place were raised by PNEUMA Division personnel. Immediately following this event, LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork teleported out of containment at Site-PT20 and replaced itself with Secretary Helissa's chair at a Council of 108 meeting. Due to LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork's properties, Secretary Helissa was transported to Site-PT20 in her council chair, where she was nearly amnesticized by on-Site personnel.

LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork was retrieved and brought to Site-17, where multiple tests were ran on it to determine its new antagonistic nature towards the GOC. During one of these tests, the object teleported to replace a chair a PNEUMA Division personnel was about to sit upon, causing him to misjudge the distance and fall over. Due to the object's hostile nature it was labeled as a KTE, and was scheduled for destruction.

DESTRUCTION ATTEMPT 001: PHYSICS Agent Mandolin was tasked with tossing LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork into the Site-17 incinerator. LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork teleported to Site-120 in response. Object was recovered.

DESTRUCTION ATTEMPT 055: Agent Mandolin was tasked with deploying explosive charges planted atop LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork. Once the charges were detonated, LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork teleported into Site-17's lobby, appearing to have temporally altered itself into a past state of being in the present. Research into whether or not this affected LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork's presence in the timeline previously is ongoing. Though LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork was destroyed in the present, its past and future self still remain.

DESTRUCTION ATTEMPT 121: PNEUMA Division Agent Soprano scheduled an announcement to be played throughout Site-17 announcing the detonation of all on-site nuclear warheads and the immediate destruction of all life on Earth, followed by a countdown timer. LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork disappeared immediately upon the countdown reaching 0. GOC personnel in Far-Future Station 726 were left instructions and information on how to dismantle LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork. For the time being, LTE-396-Velveteen-Clockwork is considered liquidated.

Everyone knows the story of SCP-1609. You don't hear the end of it if you're in my shoes. It's always the same point they make, that the GOC destroyed an anomaly and it came back to bite them in the ass.

When 396's number rolled into my inbox, I knew that it wasn't just a regular termination request. This request was charged, it being another teleporting chair and all. 121 attempts to destroy it, and its destruction wasn't even confirmed.
